Re: Marine Protected Area Monitoring in the Channel Islands

Dear Admiral Lautenbacher:

Our Sanctuary Advisory Council (SAC) has held numerous discussions regarding the anticipated release of a Draft Environmental Impact Statement for the Federal Phase of Marine Reserves at the Channel Islands National Marine Sanctuary (CINMS). As a result of these discussions, we would like to take this opportunity to urge you to assign the highest possible priority to a comprehensive program of monitoring marine protected area (MPA) effects and performance, including the effects and role of MPAs in populations of harvested marine species. Although not a specific mandate of the National Marine Sanctuary Act, there is a high level of continued interest in understanding the role MPAs play in fisheries management of sustainable fisheries within CINMS. In addition, targeted investments in marine science and monitoring were primary recommendations from the recent U.S Commission on Ocean Policy (2004) and Pew Oceans Commission (2003), and we, as concerned stakeholders of the marine environment, strongly support the growth of science for better science-based management of our marine ecosystems.

Regarding our local CINMS needs, there is strong SAC consensus that a comprehensive program of MPA monitoring is a critical part of a successful and effective ecosystem-based management effort. To that end, in order to gauge the performance of the existing and proposed zones we urge funding and attention be paid to monitoring for the entire suite of MPA goals and objectives we all support, which include Ecosystem Biodiversity, Socioeconomic viability, Sustainable Fisheries. There is also a concern that some important MPA performance questions - such as the effects of MPAs on harvested species - could suffer reduced attention and funding due to either funding limitations, lack of support from all divisions in NOAA, or competing NMSP priorities. In fact, current monitoring efforts have experienced gaps or shortfalls in a few areas: trap and fixed gear survey techniques, identification of the location of fishing effort within the Sanctuary, and calibration of different survey techniques. These subjects address important indicators of MPA performance relative to fishing, and should be included in comprehensive evaluations of MPA effectiveness.

We therefore would like to emphasize the critical importance of a comprehensive, sustained program to monitor the performance of MPAs for the full range of goals identified by the local community. As reflected in the California Department of Fish and Game's Channel Islands MPA Monitoring Plan, such an effort would include collaborative research efforts and programs such as tagging and trap/gear studies. To that end, we urge you to provide adequate and sustained long-term funding, and support from all appropriate line offices in NOAA for this critical effort.

As always, the SAC stands ready to provide on-going community input and support and we look forward to NOAA's sustained long-term funding for this critical effort.
