




The Sanctuary Advisory Council (Council) for the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration's (NOAA) Channel Islands National Marine Sanctuary is a 21-member body of community members and government agencies that advises the Sanctuary Superintendent and NOAA on management of the Sanctuary. Since 1999 the Council has been fully committed to the ongoing process that has led to designation of a network of marine reserves and conservation areas within the Channel Islands National Marine Sanctuary (CINMS). As you may know, a special Marine Reserves Working Group of the Council convened from 1999 to 2002 to help better understand marine reserves and design the network, and reached consensus on goals, objectives, and implementation recommendations.

In continuance of the goals and objectives reached by the Marine Reserves Working Group, the Council supports completion of the network of marine reserves and conservation areas within the CINMS. As you know, this requires the incorporation into the network of several "gap" areas adjacent to state and federal reserves and conservation areas. Should the Fish and Game Commission (Commission) decide to take action on this, we strongly recommend that the Commission request an expedited review by the Office of Administrative Law and request implementation upon filing with the Secretary of State. Incorporating the gap areas into the network as soon as possible will reduce public confusion about boundaries, assist law enforcement, and provide comprehensive resource protection from nearshore to offshore.

The Council also encourages the Commission to express support for the partnership between the CINMS and the California Department of Fish and Game to implement and manage the network cooperatively. We understand that a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between these agencies is in development. Please encourage completion of the MOU to help focus and implement coordinated management of the federal and state marine reserves and conservation areas.

We appreciate your consideration of our comments and stand ready to continue to work with NOAA and the California Department of Fish and Game on implementation of the full network of marine reserves and conservation areas within CINMS.
